Amherst County's newest employee is Michael Lockaby who is the Interim County Attorney. Mike Lockaby is currently the County Attorney for Botetourt County, Bath County, and Amherst County. He also continues to advise and represent localities, authorities and constitutional officers on individual projects and cases, primarily on issues of land use and real estate, utilities and telecommunications, local taxation, public finance, economic development, status transitions, and related issues.

With regard to Amherst, he says, "I'm tremendously excited to be working with Amherst.
