Interpreter Rick Sheets, in the role of a Journeyman Horner, will be on hand to demonstrate working with horn, Trish Duncan Thomas will demonstrate flax dressing, along with members of the Cardinal Lace Guild displaying their lace making skills and Dawn Smoot Doss spinning. There will also be Revolutionary War soldiers, physi-



cian/surgeon, civilians, a fifer and drummer, silversmith, blacksmith, pouch maker, music by the McKenzies, a batteau-man, and an exhibit on Colonial toys. Period games such as Rolling Hoops, Graces, Battledore & Shuttlecock, Quoits, and Ball & Cup will be available for both children and adults to engage in. Visitors will be able to try their hand at writing with a guill pen as was done in the day.
