At a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Amherst County and held at the Administration building thereof on Tuesday, the 2nd day of June, 2015, at 1:00 p.m. at which the following members were present:

I. Call to Order

Chairman Pugh called meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

II. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Supervisor Curd led Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance.

III. Approval of Agenda

By motion of Supervisor Tucker and with the following vote, the Board approved the Agenda for June 2, 2015.

IV. Citizen Comments

Mr. Jim Thompson of Madison Heights, Virginia, addressed the Board regarding an issue that came before the School Board of a proposal to locate a cell tower near Elon Elementary School. Mr. Thompson voiced his opposition and asked the Board of Supervisors for support when considering future ordinances prohibiting location of cellular towers near or on school properties.

Mr. Jason Ferguson of Madison Heights, Virginia, stated to the Board his information concerning a cell tower marketing company placing a tower on school property.

Chairman Pugh advised Mr. Ferguson the Board was not aware of the School Board's decision.

Mr. Kenny Smith of Madison Heights, Virginia, agreed with the previous speakers and voiced his concern about health issues for children and the elderly who are in close proximity to cell towers. Mr. Smith stated he is opposed to cell towers being placed on school properties.

Ms. Kim Wood of Madison Heights, Virginia addressed the Board concerning Sec. 10-7 - Prohibition of the shooting of firearms in certain areas of Amherst County. She understood this to mean the discharge a firearm from a certain distance to a home or road. Ms. Wood reported a neighbor discharging a firearm in the area of Sage Lane and understood this area was a no-shoot zone. Ms. Wood said law enforcement was contacted and she was advised nothing could be done unless it was deemed reckless. Ms. Wood asked the Board to consider this area as a no-shoot zone.

Chairman Pugh advised that he would have the County Administrator and County Attorney review this.

Supervisor Tucker asked if Ms. Wood attempted to work out a solution with this neighbor. Ms. Wood explained she had not approached this person.

V. Special Presentation

A. Winton Country Club – Reimbursement Report

Mr. Sean Taylor and Mr. Kelly Crovo of Winton County Club presented to the Board a reimbursement report regarding a \$28,000 tax refund from Amherst County. Mr. Taylor provided an update on how these funds will be used for the Club. Mr. Taylor said they will allocate funds appropriately for use of general upkeep and maintenance of the property.

Mr. Taylor said Winton County Club is a resource for the County and a full time event planner has been hired to better partner with the County for all residents to use the facility.

VII. New Business

A. Interview School Board candidates for District 2 and District 4 vacancies

Chairman Pugh called Ms. Jennifer Cumby to come forth for her interview.

Supervisor Kidd asked Question 1. - *Please tell us about your education background and qualifications to serve on the School Board. Is there any special expertise, talent, or benefit would you bring to the operation and deliberations of the School Board?*

Ms. Cumby stated she was raised in Lynchburg, graduated from Sweet Briar College, and moved to Amherst County as a reporter for the New Era Progress. Ms. Cumby said as a reporter she covered all School Board meetings and collaborated with the Board of Supervisors and others. Ms. Cumby said she has been an editor of numerous publications and developed creative ways to keep publications going. Ms. Cumby stated she is raising three children and that it takes a lot to make sure everyone's basic needs are taken care of.

Supervisor Curd asked Question 2 - *Please tell us your address and speak about your current community involvements in Amherst County.*

Ms. Cumby said she lives in the Lowesville area, is on the PTO at Temperance Elementary School and has spent much time helping out at the area schools.

Supervisor Tucker asked Question 3 - *Do you have any personal or professional involvement with the other School Board members or the School District itself? If so, please elaborate.*

Ms. Cumby stated she currently works in enrollment at Lynchburg College is involved with trends in higher education and with the local public schools including Amherst County.

Chairman Pugh asked Question 4 - *Please share your understanding of the relationship of the School Board to the Board of Supervisors. Would you like to see that relationship change? If so, what do you plan to do to effect those changes?*

Ms. Cumby said all relationships change overtime. She stated she has no specific agenda and has not been on the School Board previously. She is a fan of efficiency and not overlayering and is aware the School Board is under the oversight of the Board of Supervisors and there is a need to work together and collaborate.

Chairman Pugh asked Ms. Cumby who she serves. Ms. Cumby stated you cannot serve students without staff and teachers and all must function together to effectively serve the children and all stakeholders.

Supervisor Kidd asked Question 5 - *Please share your understanding of the role of the School Board with the School District staff, the Board's current focus and any changes you would like to see.*

Ms. Cumby stated she is more familiar with what is going on during the actual meetings and to listen to different perspectives and to address all concerns.

Supervisor Curd asked Question 6 - *What motivates your desire for public service on the School Board?*

Ms. Crumby said she has three children in public schools; she is a daughter of a public school teacher and fan of public schools and wants to personally help in the community. Ms. Cumby said she has considered serving on the School Board for some time.

Supervisor Tucker asked Question 7 - *What is your understanding of the time commitments and personal preparation time involved for those serving on the School Board?*

Ms. Cumby said she understands there is significant time spent doing research, keeping up with news and trends, and attending events for the schools and taking an active role.

Chairman Pugh asked Question 8 - *Are there any particular policies of the School Board that you believe need to be addressed? What changes would you like to see in those policies?*

Ms. Cumby stated she does not have an agenda but has an idea of the way things should be and how necessary it is to have good people working with you.

Supervisor Kidd asked Question 9 - *What do you see as the largest issues facing the Amherst County Schools, and what thoughts have you given to solutions? Elaborate on the steps you might take as a School Board member to increase community awareness of school issues and engage the community more readily in developing solutions.*

Ms. Cumby said budgetary concerns are the largest issues facing the schools because schools are forced to cut the pie into infinitely smaller slices. She would like to see how funds are allocated and the ability to save money by using resources and ways to use people who live here in the County. Ms. Cumby said she has a background in social media marketing and wants to connect with people in a more creative way.

Supervisor Curd asked Question 10 - *In an environment of shrinking budgets and increased demands in the field of education, how do you see the role of the individual School Board member affecting this situation?*

Ms. Cumby stated it is necessary to always watch your bottom line just as you would with a household budget, using what you have and listen to people to get as many opinions as you can.

The interview for Ms. Cumby ended and Chairman Pugh thanked her for her time.

Chairman Pugh asked Ms. Priscilla Liggon to come forth for her interview. Chairman Pugh thanked Ms. Liggon for her sixteen years of service.

Supervisor Kidd asked Question 1 - *Please tell us about your education background and qualifications to serve on the School Board. Is there any special expertise, talent, or benefit would you bring to the operation and deliberations of the School Board?*

Ms. Liggon stated she was educated in Amherst County and is an educator and active in various education workshops.

Supervisor Curd asked Question 2 - *Please tell us your address and speak about your current community involvements in Amherst County.*

Ms. Liggon said she has lived in Madison Height for 35 years; serves a as minister of music at her church; is the Amherst County representative to the Lynchburg Community Action Group and employed by Centra Health.

Supervisor Tucker stated Question 3 was not applicable. (*Do you if you have any personal or professional involvement with the other School Board members or the School District itself? If so, please elaborate*) and asked Question 4 - *Please share your understanding of the relationship of the School Board to the Board of Supervisors. Would you like to see that relationship change? If so, what do you plan to do to effect those changes?*

Ms. Liggon stated she realizes the School Board and the Board of Supervisors are "kissin cousins" and for us to work together without malice or hardship even if we may not agree, but you can always meet half way.

Chairman Pugh asked Question 5 - *Please share your understanding of the role of the School Board with the School District staff, the Board's current focus and any changes you would like to see.*

Ms. Liggon said she sees people by visiting schools and principals and has a good relationship with them.

Chairman Pugh asked Ms. Liggon who she serves. Ms. Liggon stated she took an oath to serve the children and anyone else who needs her help with the children.

Supervisor Kidd asked Question 6 - *What motivates your desire for public service on the School Board?*

Ms. Liggon said she enjoys learning and has learned much more about the budget and the budget process.

Supervisor Curd asked Question 7 - *What is your understanding of the time commitments and personal preparation time involved for those serving on the School Board?*

Ms. Liggon stated she realizes the time commitments and prepares by reading and staying abreast of all issues.

Supervisor Tucker 8 - *Are there any particular policies of the School Board that you believe need to be addressed? What changes would you like to see in those policies?*

Ms. Liggon said most policies come from the state and she would not change policy unless there is a need.

Chairman Pugh asked Question 9 - *What do you see as the largest issues facing the Amherst County Schools, and what thoughts have you given to solutions? Elaborate on the steps you might take as a School Board member to increase community awareness of school issues and engage the community more readily in developing solutions.*

Ms. Liggon stated there is always a funding issue and she would like to see the schools as a safe environment for children and with more funding and less mandates.

Supervisor Kidd asked Question 10 - *In an environment of shrinking budgets and increased demands in the field of education, how do you see the role of the individual School Board member affecting this situation?*

Ms. Liggon said her role is to be an advocate and have legislatures come and visit as much as possible, not forget Amherst County and to voice your opinion and vote.

The interview for Ms. Liggon ended.

Chairman Pugh stated that a public hearing will be held on June 16, 2015 regarding the appointment of candidates for District 2 and District 4 seats to the Amherst County School Board.

By motion of Chairman Pugh and with the following vote, the Board reappointed Robb Simpkins, District 1; Larry Langhans, District 4, and Stephen Witham, District 5 to their respective seats on the Library Board of Trustees, each for a four year term expiring June 30, 2019.



A RESOLUTION, NO. 2015-0011-R

A resolution, approving the Secondary Six-Year Road Plan covering the period 2016 through 2021, and a Construction Priority List for fiscal year 2016.

Approved as to form by the County Attorney

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF AMHERST, VIRGINIA:

I. That the Amherst County Board of Supervisors ("Board") hereby adopts the Virginia Department of Transportation's Secondary Six-Year Road Plan covering the period 2016 through 2021, and the Construction Priority List for fiscal year 2016, both as prepared for Amherst County, as follows:

WHEREAS, Virginia Code §§ 33.2-358 and 33.2-364 provide the opportunity for each county to work with the Virginia Department of Transportation in developing a Secondary Six-year Road Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board had previously agreed to assist in preparation of this Plan, in accordance with the Virginia Department of Transportation policies and procedures, and participated in a public hearing on the proposed Plan (2016 through 2021) as well as the Construction Priority List (Fiscal Year 2016) on May 19, 2015, duly advertised so that all citizens of the County had the opportunity to participate in said hearing and to make comments and recommendations concerning the proposed Plan and Priority List; and

WHEREAS, Don Austin, Residency Administrator, Virginia Department of Transportation, appeared before the Board and recommended approval of the Six-year Plan for Secondary Roads (2016 through 2021) and the Construction Priority List (Fiscal Year 2016) for Amherst County, at the May 19, 2015, public hearing; and


WHEREAS, that Six-year Plan for Secondary Roads (2016 through 2021) and the Construction Priority List (Fiscal Year 2016) for Amherst County are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
OF THE COUNTY OF AMHERST, VIRGINIA:**


As the Plan and Priority List appear to be in the best interests of the secondary road system in Amherst County and of the citizens utilizing that secondary system, the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the Secondary Six-Year Plan (2016 through 2021) and Construction Priority List (Fiscal Year 2016) as those were presented and modified at the public hearing on May 19, 2105.

II. That this resolution shall be in force and effect upon adoption.
