IV. Citizen Comments

Chairman Pugh opened the Citizen Comments section.

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Ms. Gloria Witt of Madison Heights, Virginia, addressed the Board regarding her concern with the Ordinance 2015-0004 dealing with business licensing. Ms. Whitt said she would like to have this ordinance repealed or rewritten due to the language regarding the convicted felons.

Chairman Pugh closed the Citizen Comments section.

V. Special Presentation

A. Amherst County Virginia Cooperative Extension Office – Alyssa Elliott, Extension Agent, ANR – Report on the 2015 Amherst-Nelson Farm and Family Day

Ms. Elliott provided a report to the Board regarding the 2015 Amherst-Nelson Farm and Family day that was held at Lazy Days Winery in Amherst held on September 12, 2015.

Ms. Elliott said this event featured a variety of farm animals and vendors including local farmers' market vendors and she estimated that approximately 250 people attended.

Ms. Elliott expressed her hope to see more vendors and activities in following years. She will be heading the planning committee for next year to hopes to make this an annual event.

B. Larry Jackson, Region 2000 EDA and Lynchburg Chamber of Commerce Merger

Mr. Jackson, a volunteer of the Region 2000 Business and Economic Development Alliance addressed the Board and explained the difference between the Region 2000 Business Economic Development Alliance and the Region 2000 Local Government Council. Mr. Jackson said the Business and Economic Development Alliance markets this region providing prospects to investors and creating jobs with an increased emphasis on economic development marketing of this region. He described the status of the plans to merge the Alliance with the Lynchburg Chamber and explained some of the anticipated benefits.

Vice-Chair Tucker added that in the past Amherst County has lacked involvement and said she looks forward to the County's participation.

Chairman Pugh agreed and said it is vital to have the County fairly represented in this merger and to have a voice.

IX. Old Business

A. EDA - Endorsement of FY2015-16 EDA Action Plan

Victoria Hanson, EDA Director, presented to the Board an annual update to the EDA action plan that outlined the EDA work plan for the year. Ms. Hanson outlined several major items:

Lowes 10-year Incentive Agreement has been completed; Quality Archery Design's 5-year Incentive Agreement will be completed soon; Amelon Commerce Center covenants have been revised; assisted with the Verizon building in Brockman Commerce Park with Town of Amherst; responded to potential closing to CVCC's Amherst location; accomplished launching a new website; continued working on incubator in the Amelon Commence Center; working with CVCC on the lease; liaison with Region 2000 and the Virginia Economic Development partnership organization.

Vice-Chair Tucker asked if the EDA has done any outreach with Second Stage. Ms. Hanson advised that the majority of the funding that Second Stage requires is not necessarily the kind the EDA can help with; however, she provided Second Stage contact information to seek possible grant funding.

Chairman Pugh asked about the Region 2000 Workforce Development Board that conducts job fairs and would like to see this for Amherst County. He also suggested advertising in the *Virginia Business Magazine* to get Amherst County's name out there.

Chairman Pugh thanked Ms. Hanson and appreciated all the work the EDA has been doing.

B. Planning/Zoning & Purchasing - Train Depot - Phase III Bids

Jeremy Bryant, Planning/Zoning Director addressed the Board regarding the Train Depot-Phase III Bids. Mr. Bryant advised that on October 5, 2015 bids were received for Phase III of the Amherst County Train Depot project that included completion of the building interior, parking lot paving, a train signal, an exterior rail and lighting.

Mr. Bryant stated he was advised by VDOT that the low bidder, Jamerson-Lewis (\$394,493) did not successfully submit their bid. Mr. Bryant advised that Custom Structures was the next lowest bidder at \$422,816.

Mr. Bryant informed the Board that because Custom Structures price exceeded the cost estimates for Phase III of the Train Depot, staff needs direction from the Board on two options: Option 1: Re-bid the Train Depot – Phase III project (estimated cost for rebidding should not exceed \$4,000); and Option 2: Appropriate \$26,816 and award the Phase III Train Depot bid to Custom Structures (\$422,816 = Custom Structures Bid; \$24,000 = Architectural Firm's Estimated Fee; \$446,816 = Estimated Total).

Chairman Pugh clarified that the bid bond was not included and Mr. Bryant responded affirmatively.

By motion of Supervisor Kidd and with the following vote, the Board chose Option 1 to re-bid the Train Depot – Phase III project and the estimated cost for rebidding not to exceed \$4,000.

X. County Attorney

A. Resolution 2015-0015-R, a resolution, expressing the County's intention to accept deeds to various parcels of real property underlying and surrounding Learning Lane so that Learning Lane may be transferred to the Virginia Department of Transportation for placement into the State secondary road system.

Ellen Bowyer, Amherst County Attorney, addressed the Board regarding Resolution 2015-0015-R. This resolution states the Board's intent to proceed with acquiring various parcels of property surrounding Learning Lane, to accept deeds conveying the property, and to authorize the Chairman to sign the deeds. Once this is completed, the property can be transferred to the Virginia Department of Transportation for inclusion into the secondary road system

Chairman Pugh clarified that Learning Lane is the road that goes to Madison Heights Elementary School. Chairman Pugh stated there has been a problem with drainage from a nearby shopping center that has compromised the integrity of this County-owned road and the County is in the process of acquiring property to transfer to VDOT for placement in the State secondary road system.

By motion of Vice-Chair Tucker and with the following vote, the Board adopted Resolution 2015-0015-R and directed staff to obtain its approval to any purchase of any real property underlying or surrounding Learning Lane prior to closing on such property, and that the Board expresses its intention to accept deeds to the various parcels of real property underlying and surrounding Learning Lane, and that the Board hereby authorizes its Chairman to sign such deeds to evidence the County's acceptance of the same. A RESOLUTION, NO. 2015-0015-R

A resolution, expressing the County's intention to accept deeds to various parcels of real property underlying and surrounding Learning Lane so that Learning Lane may be transferred to the Virginia Department of Transportation for placement into the State secondary road system.

Approved as to form by the County Attorney

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF AMHERST, VIRGINIA:

I. That the Amherst County Board of Supervisors ("Board") hereby expresses its intention to accept deeds to various parcels of real property underlying and surrounding Learning Lane so that Learning Lane may be transferred to the Virginia Department of Transportation for placement into the State secondary road system, as follows:

WHEREAS, Amherst County wishes to have Learning Lane – the street providing access to Madison Heights Elementary School at 287 Learning Lane, Madison Heights, Virginia – accepted into the State secondary road system; and

WHEREAS, in order to transfer Learning Lane to the Virginia Department of Transportation, the County must acquire title to the real property underlying and surrounding Learning Lane; and

WHEREAS, County staff are in the process of negotiating to acquire such real property; and

WHEREAS, once County staff complete the negotiations, the County Attorney will approve the form of the deeds necessary to effect transfer of such real property to County ownership; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to express the County's intention to accept the deeds conveying such real property upon their presentation to the Board.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF AMHERST, VIRGINIA:

That the Board directs staff to obtain its approval to any purchase of any real property underlying or surrounding Leaning Lane prior to closing on such purchase.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Board expresses its intention to accept deeds to the various parcels of real property underlying and surrounding Learning Lane.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Board hereby authorizes its Chairman to sign such deeds as are approved as to form by the County Attorney to evidence the County's acceptance of the same.
