I. Call to Order

At a regular meeting of the Amherst County Board of Supervisors held on May 18, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., the following members were present:

Chair Moore called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Chair Moore stated that Board meetings are now being streamed live on Facebook and on YouTube.

II. Approval of Agenda

By motion of Supervisor Tucker and with the following vote, the Board amended the Agenda for May 18, 2021 and postponed Item A. Adopt School Board Budget under VII. Old Business to a future meeting after the Joint Board Committee Meeting on June 1, 2021 at 5:00 p.m.

III. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Supervisor Martin led the Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance.

IV. Citizen Comment

Mr. Ronald Kzarek of Madison Heights, Virginia addressed the Board regarding excessive speeding on Possum Hollow Road.

Ms. Lillian Johnson of Amherst, Virginia addressed the Board regarding the Social Justice Lessons topic. Ms. Johnson said she would address the Board later when this matter comes up on tonight's agenda.

Mr. Sidney Storozum of Monroe, Virginia addressed the Board regarding the Critical Race Theory (CRT). He urged the Board to postpone approval of the School budget until Supervisors can properly educate themselves to have a full and transparent disclosure of what is going on with this issue.

V. Public Hearing

A. VDOT Rural Rustic Priority List FY22-FY27

Mr. Robert Brown, VDOT Residency Administrator addressed the Board and presented the proposed Amherst County Six-Year Plan and the Rural Rustic Priority List FT22-FY27.

Mr. Brown explained the plan, outlined the construction for county roads over the next six years and the funding of how monies are allocated for unpaved roads.

He advised Lavender Lane and Campbell's Mill Road are under construction and nearing completion; East Perch Road will be built this year; Fox Hall Drive is scheduled for 2022; and Shady Mountain and Chestnut Lane are slated for surface treatment in May 2023. (See Attachment 1)

Mr. Brown advised that included in this plan are drainage issues, which will help with replacement of pipes and culverts on secondary roads in Amherst County.

To answer Supervisor Tucker's question about the grass-cutting budget, Mr. Brown stated that VDOT would perform all in-house mowing and anticipates that it will begin now and continue through June and July.

County Administrator Rodgers provided the Board with a proposed Rural Rustic Priority List FY22-FY27 Draft 5/17/21 and said the list was crafted by staff recommendation using the lowest cost and highest vehicle count.

The Board agreed to accept this list as presented. (See Attachment 2).

The Public Hearing was opened.

Proponents: Mr. Donald Painter of Amherst, Virginia, addressed the Board and appreciated that funding has been approved for resurfacing Chestnut Lane in 2023.

The Public Hearing was closed.

By motion of Vice-Chair Pugh and with the following vote, the Board approved the priority list ranking of unfunded rural road projects as proposed by staff recommendation.

B. Food Truck Ordinance 2021-0004

Community Development Director Jeremy Bryant presented the proposed ordinance that would regulate food trucks, trailers and carts. He said the County has no regulations that govern these operations.

Mr. Bryant advised that the Planning Commission at its April 15, 2021 meeting recommended approval of the proposed ordinance.

A. Adopt School Board Budget

This item was postponed to a future meeting after the Joint Board Committee Meeting on June 1, 2021 at 5:00 p.m.

VIII. New Business

A. Social Justice Lessons

County Administrator Rodgers addressed the Board about the Social Justice Lessons being taught in the schools. He understood that Board members had received questions from the community about this curriculum and Supervisors were not aware that the School Board had gone through a process to inform parents to teach these lessons.

Mr. Rodgers advised he compiled a list of those questions and sent them to the School Superintendent and School Board Chair. He said the School Board voted not to attend tonight's meeting to address those questions but asked that a special meeting be held. Mr. Rodgers said the Joint Board Committee, comprised of two Supervisors and two School Board members, would hold a meeting on June 1 at 5:00 p.m. to discuss those questions and answers. The other members of the Board of Supervisors and School Board would also be invited to attend and a public comment session would be included as part of this meeting. Chair Moore opened the public comment session.

Ms. Lillian Johnson of Amherst, Virginia addressed the Board and expressed her displeasure with the curriculum and recommended reading material that was provided. She said the Critical Race Theory's (CRT) agenda is to teach this theory beginning at age one and will be monitored.

Ms. Johnson said as a citizen she was opposed to this and sees nothing but blacks against whites, discrimination and the promotion of racism. She said CRT is not based on truth but combating racism with racism.

Mr. Sid Storozum of Monroe, Virginia addressed the Board and asked if the public could direct questions to the School Superintendent at the June 1 meeting.

Mr. Rodgers stated the Joint Board Committee does not have any Rules of Procedure in place and the Committee would have to address that at the June 1 meeting.

Mr. Storozum said that the only leverage the Board of Supervisors has is to approve the School's budget. He said our community is not ready for the "brainwashing and fear factor" and a strategy of putting children against their parents. He further commented these are young impressionable children and the schools have attempted to minimize the roles that families and religious institutions play.

Mr. Rodgers informed the Board he was asked to read two letters that were submitted by Mr. Jason Baker and Mr. Michael Despres and to be included as part of the public comment session. (See Attachments 3 and 4)

Supervisor Tucker then remarked that the Board of Supervisors have been supportive of the School Board. She said when taxpayers came to the Board with questions and concerns, the Board took those questions and wanted an open and transparent dialogue with the School Board. She said there was no "power play" by the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Martin wanted to clarify that a referendum was voted on by the citizens of the County to elect School Board members, and that the Board of Supervisors did not have any say in how that was done. Mr. Martin encouraged all citizens to contact each School Board member and express their views.

B. County Forest Management

Purchasing Agent David Proffitt presented information to the Board for a plan to harvest timber on County-owned property. He advised a RFP has been prepared to hire a professional forester to develop a comprehensive stewardship plan of County tracts of land. Mr. Proffitt said he would return to the Board with details before the harvesting process begins.

Vice-Chair Pugh said he would like to see old growth forests preserved. He said the price of timber is down, however, the cost of finished lumber is up and he agrees going through the right avenue with the forestry plan.

Supervisor Martin requested that the County proceed with caution and suggested the harvesting and replanting of those areas be done environmentally and in a systematic way.

IX. County Administrator's Report

A. Non-Interference Agreement

County Administrator Rodgers addressed the Board regarding a Non-Interference Agreement between the County and the Service Authority.

Mr. Rodgers said that beneath the RiverEdge Trail is the main sewer line for the Service Authority. He said ACSA requires that the County take responsibility if that line is damaged due to the expansion of the RiverEdge Trail construction project.

Mr. Rodgers asked that the Board authorize him to sign the agreement.

By motion of Supervisor Ayers and with the following vote, the Board approved the Non-Interference Agreement and granted the County Administrator authority to execute the agreement upon final review and approval of the County Attorney.

A. Financial Software Consultant Update

IT Director Jackie Viar addressed the Board and presented an update on the replacement vendor for the County's new financial and tax collection software.

Ms. Viar reported that five proposals were received and the top three were chosen by a group of five individuals consisting of one Constitutional officer, the Finance Director, David Proffitt, the IT Director and one citizen with extensive software knowledge.

She said the consultant will meet with each department and then develop an RFP.

Ms. Viar advised that the first phase will be to draft the RFP for the software and the second phase will oversee the project as an implementation specialist and work directly with her as the Project Manager on behalf of the County.

Supervisor Martin asked Ms. Viar about the funding for the software and the cost of the consultant. Ms. Viar referred to the Board's September 2020 minutes that reiterated staying within the limits of the money that the Board approved for the total software package.

XIII. Citizen Comment

Mr. Ronnie Wright of Amherst County addressed the Board and provided information on his progress with trash pickup in the County.

The superintendent of the school board should stand down and resign or be fired for allowing this to happen. Bring back the 1776 Commission ("patriotic education").
