The short-term tourist rental of a dwelling that is within 500' of another dwelling is a special exception in the A-1, Agricultural Residential district. Therefore, this public hearing is required for the proposed use of the short-term tourist rental of a dwelling to be approved.

#### B. Ordinance 2023-2 - Transient Occupancy Tax Ordinance

County Attorney Mark Popovich presented the Board with Ordinance 2023-2. With the growth of accommodation intermediaries being used to make reservations for hotels, motels, inns, short-term rentals and other types of accommodation, the Commissioners of the Revenue Association of Virginia has been looking for ways to enhance local transient occupancy tax ordinances in order to make sure the payment of such tax is being done appropriately and that necessary information is being provided by such intermediaries. The proposed changes to the County's transient occupancy tax ordinance is based upon the Association's efforts to develop a uniform type of ordinance for all localities to use and benefit from.

The County Attorney mentioned that a number of opioid defendant firms have agreed to global settlements that are an estimated 18.7 billion dollar payout to localities and states throughout the United States. Mr. Popovich stated that if these settlements are reached in accordance with the terms contained therein and with certain incentives included therein the Virginia share is anticipated to be somewhere around 425 million dollars. The actual amount that will come to each locality is not yet known because we have to wait for those incentive numbers to come in.

Supervisor Tucker reported that budget meetings are taking most of the School Boards time and they are still talking about some things operationally in the schools.

By motion of Vice-Chair Ayers and with the following vote, the Board adjourned at 7:33 pm.




