# 1. CALL TO ORDER

#### 4. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

Mr. Mitchell, Assistant Zoning Administrator/Planner, briefed the Planning Commission on the upcoming meeting dates for the Comprehensive Plan, which is for Board of Supervisors review on April 2, 2013 and a joint public hearing between the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors on May 21, 2013.

# 5. PRESENTATION BY DAN FRENCH - SERVICE AUTHORITY - PACKAGE PLANTS & WATERSHED

Dan French, Director of the Public Utilities, discussed two package plants in the Winesap Road area and the current state and future goals for the Amherst county Service Authority's sewer system. Mr. French stated that there are currently two individual package plants in use in Invanhoe Forest and WestBriar Place subdivisions and that these plants get good reviews from the Department of Environmental Quality and has been updated over time. The WestBriar Place package plant releases into the Harris Creek Watershed that provides drinking water to Madison Heights. The current County Code does not allow individual package plants. Mr. French explained the history of how the Service Authority came to operate these facilities and the desire to eventually install lift stations to pump sewage to existing sewer lines on U.S. 29. Mr. French estimated that currently each plant cost the county approximately \$5,000 per year due to the cost of operation exceeding the user cist if water rates. Mr. French stated that the future Chesapeake Bay Act regulations for the removal of nitrogen and phosphorous would likely lead to a need to make the improvements. Mr. French then presented an overview of the current sewer system and the future extension plans for the system. Following Mr. French's presentation, the Planning Commission further discussed the issue of the two (2) package plants. The Commission discussed their role in suggesting projects for incorporation into the Capital Improvement Plan.

Motion to encourage the Board of Supervisors to consider replacing the existing package plants at Ivanhoe Forest and Westbriar Place subdivisions at some point in the future

and work in estimates for work into the Capital

Improvement Plan. The rationale for this motion is the loss of \$10,000 per year to the current water system, the

future potential impact of the Chesapeake Bay Act regulations, and potential problems relating to flow into the channel that feeds the Madison Heights water system.
