Each year many people are injured as a result of deck failures that may have been avoided by performing basic preventive maintenance

DECK SAFETY.

- 40,000,000 decks in the US over 20 years old
 If even 1% are unsafe, 40,000 decks are unsafe
 2000-2006 Deck Related Incidents
 30 deaths
- 350 injuries 75% of persons in deck collapse are likely to be killed or injured

DECK FAILURES CAN OCCUR FOR VARIOUS REASONS.

- Faulty construction methods.
- Improper or unsuitable materials.
- Lack of Maintenance.

NEW DECKS AND SUBSTANTIAL REPAIRS NEED A PERMIT.

There are a lot of factors that go into deck safety.
It is important to have a permit and an inspection to make sure you and your family are safe when spending time on your new deck

OLDER DECKS SHOULD BE LOOKED OVER EACH YEAR.

- Check support posts and beams for rot, splitting or abnormal movement
- Closely check the attachment points between the house and deck.
 Check all fasteners, bolts, brackets, etc., for rust and corrosion.
- Check all guards and rails to be sure they are sturdy and well secured.
