#### **County Releases New Permit Application for Parades and Demonstrations**

Amherst County Administration office published a new permit application for parades and demonstrations. The Board of Supervisors finds that for the good government and the peace, safety, health, and welfare of the County and its citizens, they must require a county permit to use streets, sidewalks, and public spaces.

In 2019, the Amherst County Board of Supervisors adopted <u>Ord. No. 2019-0003</u>. This ordinance requires citizens to complete the application and seek approval in order to hold parades and demonstrations on County-owned property. The <u>new application</u> will aid citizens in this process and can be found on the County's homepage under the "How Do I" tab.

In addition to the application, a Public Safety Plan is required for any parade or demonstration expected to include more than 50 participants and/or spectators or that, due to the route or location, causes a public safety concern for the participants and spectators. The plan must be reviewed by the Sheriff and should cover security, fire, emergency medical service, and dispersal.

# HOLDING A DEMONSTRATION OR PARADE





# DEFINITIONS PARADE:

Any march or other procession of six or more people is considered a parade.

#### **DEMONSTRATION:**

A group of three or more people assembled together to show their support or opposition to any political, social, or public issue.

#### PERMITS

The Board of Supervisors finds that it is necessary for the good government and the peace, safety, health, and welfare of the county and its citizens, as well as to maintain law and order and to provide for the free and orderly flow of traffic to require a county permit to use the streets, sidewalks, and public places.

#### AMHERST COUNTY, VA CODE OF ORDINANCE

Article V1. Demonstrations and Parades

#### PERMITS

A permit must be obtained from the County Administrator by providing the following information at least ten days before the desired event.



The date, start time, and duration of the event.





Whether the event will be conducted on foot or with vehicles or animals and the number of people/animals/vehicles expected to participate.



The purpose of the event.



The names and addresses of the sponsors of the event and any organization(s) the expected participants are members of.




The number of expected participants and spectators.



The names and addresses of the person in charge of the event who will be responsible for the conduct of participants and compliance with all applicable laws.



A description of any sound amplification equipment expected to be used.





Any additional information as resonably requested by the County Administator.

# **EVENT ORGANIZERS AND SPONSORS**

Name and address of the person responsible for the event and compliance with laws.

Name(s) and address(s) of the actual sponsors of the event and any known organizations attendees are affiliated with.

### **EVENT INFORMATION**

Date, time, and duration of the event.

Purpose of the event.

The street, sidewalks, and public places where the event will take place. (Include parade route if applicable)

Will the event be conducted on foot, with animals, or in vehicles?

The number of people, animals, or vehicles expected to participate.

Total number of people expected to be present as participants and spectators.

Description of any sound-amplification equipment expected to be used.

# **PUBLIC SAFETY PLAN**

For events where more than 50 participants and/or spectators are expected, or with a route or location that would cause public safety concerns, the applicant must submit a public safety plan for security, emergency medical services, and dispersal. The plan must be reviewed by the Sheriff and be attached to the application.
