I. Call to Order

At a regular meeting of the Amherst County Board of Supervisors held on November 21, 2023 at 7:00 p.m., the following members were present:

II. Approval of Agenda

By motion of Vice-Chair Wade and with the following vote, the Board approved the agenda with the amendment of adding Item B. Commemorative Resolution 2023-5-CR under Section VII. Special Presentation.

III. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Vice- Chair Wade led the Invocation and Chair Martin led the Pledge of Allegiance.

IV. Citizen Comment

Before opening Citizen Comment, Chair Martin made a statement on behalf of the Board regarding the Courthouse monument. He stated that the Board does not desire to alter, move or relocate the monument. Mr. Martin stated that the Board does direct the County Administrator to form a committee to develop an interpretive sign concerning the monument that will consider multiple viewpoints and perspectives and further directed the County Administrator to have the committee present a recommendation on that signage within six months.

Mr. Ronnie Emmerson addressed the Board, stating he is with the Virginia Employee Support of Guard Reserve. Mr. Emmerson stated he handles the area from Danville to Lynchburg and Nelson County, Bedford, Roanoke, and Staunton. He said that he educates employers and employees about the Guard and Reserve and what their rights are. Mr. Emmerson said individuals in the Guard and Reserve nominate individuals for the Patriot Award, and that is his reasoning for being at the meeting tonight. Captain Jordan Seay is a member of the Army Reserve who works with Supervisor Tucker, and he nominated her to receive the Patriot Award. Mr. Emmerson and Captain Jordan Seay presented the award to Mrs. Tucker.

V. Public Hearing

A. Rezoning 2023-478 Shirley Marie Tomlin Bryant

Request by Shirley Bryant for a rezoning request of approximately 1.09 acres from the R-1, Limited Residential District, and P-1, Public Lands District to the R-2, General Residential District. The purpose of the rezoning is to allow for a manufactured home (double-wide) to be placed on the property. The property is identified as tax map number(s) 139-A-42D, E.

The request includes an amendment to the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) of the Amherst County Comprehensive Plan from low-density residential to medium-density residential in the area identified on the proposed rezoning map.

The Planning Commission recommended approval of rezoning request 2023-478 for Shirley Marie Tomlin Bryant as well as amending the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) of the Amherst County Comprehensive Plan.

The Public Hearing was opened.

It was moved that the Board appropriate funds from the Unobligated General Fund Balance into the FY 24 operating budgets of maintenance, purchasing, and circuit court as described in the attachment.

D. Emergency Services Council - Use of funds

It was moved that the Board approve the payment of \$2,000.00 from the Emergency Services Council Capital Expense Funds.

E. Appropriation for School Renovation Permit Fee

It was moved that the Board appropriate \$18,308.61 from the Unobligated General Fund Balance for the School Renovation Project permit fee.

Amherst County Parks Passport and Patch Program

A Girl Scout Silver Award Project by Caitlyn Baxter

Introduction

I am Caitlyn Baxter. I have recently earned my Girl Scout Silver Award which is the highest award a Cadette Girl Scout can achieve. Girl Scouting has three levels of highest awards: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Bronze Award is earned by younger scouts, and Gold is earned by older scouts. The goal of a Silver Award project is to partner with a community organization to provide a sustainable solution to a community need.

For my Silver Award Project, I established the Amherst County Parks Passport. I surveyed twenty of my peers and found that 45% had never been to an Amherst County Park, and none had been to more than two Amherst County Parks. I addressed the community need of people not utilizing all six Amherst County Parks.

How the Passport Program Works

Step 1

Pick up your Amherst County Parks Passport from the Amherst County Recreation and Tourism Office. Or download and print at home from the Recreation and Tourism website.

Step 2

Bring your passport to each of the 6 County Parks. Look for the Parks Passport sign, and take a rubbing of the engraved plaque at each location.

Step 3

Bring your passport with all 6 validations to the Recreation & Tourism office to receive your FREE patch



Summary of the Project

- Created 10-page Parks Passport booklet
- Created a Parks Passport Patch
- Hosted six events to promote the Parks Passport Program, and created educational activity guides
- Installed signage at all Amherst County Parks to correspond with the passport
- Advertised Parks Passport Program on Amherst County Parks and Recreation's website and social media

Events – 1 per park location

- · Leave No Trace at Mill Creek Lake
- Survival Bracelet Craft at Thrashers Lake
- · Learn About Citizen Science at Riveredge
- Home-Made Hiking Snacks at Monacan
- Watercolor painting Stonehouse Lake
- Hiking safety and First Aid at Coolwell

Impact

- I distributed 35 Amherst County Parks Passports at 6 Amherst County Parks
- · A total 54 people attended the community events
- 100% of people said they had fun
- I handed out 42 Leave No Trace bag tags to people at Mill Creek Park when I hosted a trash clean-up activity there
- I provided additional 65 passports and 100 patches to the Amherst County Recreation and Tourism department to distribute to people who visit and want to participate in the program in the future
